Dear Colleagues:

Thank you for your willingness and interest in joining members of the [Chicago Collaborative](#) in a special meeting of the Collaborative on November 10, 2010 at the Marriott Wardman Park Hotel in Washington, D.C. Our session is entitled “Ensuring Persistent Access to the Scientific Record”. Please note that you do not need to prepare a presentation. This is an unusual meeting in that it is meant to be a wide-ranging discussion around the major issues and themes of archiving and preservation rather than a series of presentations. We are interested in your special expertise and experience for the enrichment of our collective knowledge in this important area and for follow-up discussion and future action.

Clifford Lynch, Executive Director of the Coalition for Networked Information, will help keep us on track as we explore the following themes.

- Why is archiving recorded knowledge important?
- What are the roles and expectations for various types of organizations?
Who should be involved: Who has responsibility for archiving? Is it possible to use collaborative approaches?
- How do you engage faculty and students in a positive fashion?
- Strategies for archiving: Do differences exist based on purpose of content (e.g., research versus teaching/learning) or on field or discipline (e.g., medicine versus life sciences)
- Identification of needed resources

This special meeting of the Chicago Collaborative grew out of several discussions at previous spring and fall meetings of the Collaborative around the issues of disruptive technologies, sustainable funding, scientific society viability, and outmoded archiving assumptions such as the assumption that libraries and other organizations have addressed persistent access to print and digital content. The issue of archiving and persistence is most critical for “endangered” societies whose valuable scholarly output is in danger of disappearing when the society disappears or is incorporated into a larger publishing organization.

Attached is an agenda for the November 10 session which will begin with a continental breakfast at 8:00 a.m. and end with a group lunch at the meeting hotel. Please note that you
